### Central European Alp-Cup (CEAC)

The CEAC was launched in 2007 to give Platu25 sailors from Southern Germany, Switzerland, Austria and Northern Italy the opportunity to compete in class regattas in their local area.

The CEAC consists of four regattas with fleets of between 15 and 25 boats. Each regatta is highly competitive and professionally organized on water as well as on land. The entertainment and after-sailing social program have contributed to the growth of the class spirit and increased the number of participants.

After three years of successful competitive racing in Central Europe we would like to invite sailors from further afield to participate in the 4<sup>th</sup> CEAC Event. The dates for the fourth season are agreed, and we hope that by communicating them now many more sailors will be able to fit the CEAC into their 2010 sailing season.

## Regulations of the 4. Central European Alp-Cup 2010

The regulations are based on fair sailing and sportsmanship.

### Rules:

Qualification for participation in the CEAC 2010 is based on the IPCA regulations 2008.

For establishing ratings of individual boats during the CEAC 2010 only the results of previously sailed class regattas will be counted. There is no further link to the regatta or their organizers. All Platu25 yachts complying with the conditions for participation of the race rating are eligible to take part. The sail-number and boat name will be used for identification. The helmsman and/or crew may be changed for each Regatta.

### Scoring:

- To win the CEAC a yacht (as designated by the sail number) must have participated in at least three of the four regattas.
- If a yacht competes in all four regattas the score of the lowest series will be discarded.
- Should not all races in a category be sailed the regatta will still count towards the overall result, but the rating (1) will be omitted.

### Scoring Formula:

The series will be scored using the formula  $P=100/N*(N-R+1)*F$  where:

P	=	Points
N	=	Number of Participants
R	=	Rank
F	=	Rating

### Trophy prize giving

The prize giving of the CEAC is scheduled for Sunday, 5. September 2010 following the last race of CEAC Act 4 at Lago di Como. An award in goods will be presented to the overall winner.

To receive the prize the winning team must attend the ceremony; the prize will not be shipped.
